Boerne, TX - as unique as our name

- Kendall County fastest growing county in Texas; next to the 7th largest city in the nation
- IH 10 traffic
- Every day city staff and elected officials strive to deliver exceptional and timely services
- Quality of life phrase means different things to different people
- With all that is happening around us, growth takes on many challenges - we can't bury our heads in the sand!



Quality of life and growth

- As we deal with quality of life and growth, we have the following goals:
 - Financial sustainability
 - Infrastructure investment
 - Diverse and vibrant economy
 - Excellent and timely service delivery
 - Transparent, inclusive, and collaborative governance
 - Professional, energized, and talented workforce





City finances



- \$77 million budget; 27 city departments, 250 employees
- City's property tax rate is \$0.47 not changed in 7 years
- Over the last 14 years city tax rate increase has been less than 2 cents
- Highest financial award for 30 years in a row!



Revenue vs costs

- If tax rate is raised 1 penny, revenue to the city is about \$163,000
 - new police officer cost = \$78k
 - New firefighter cost = \$68k
- Number 1 complaint mobility
- Example State Highway 46E
 - \$10 million project
 - City and county each providing \$550,000
- \$100 million in new tax value added equates to about \$463,000
- Kendall Parkway

MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS




Approximately \$100 million

- IH10 Frontage Road complete (City & TXDOT)
- Scenic Loop at IH 10 summer 2018 (City, Kendall Co & TXDOT)
- SH 46 expansion Herff to Ammann begin late 2018 (City, Kendall Co & TXDOT)
- IH10 at US 87 exit intersection (TXDOT) / 2020
- Bandera Road overpass at IH10 TBD (TXDOT) / 2020
- US 87/Main St repaving & marking summer 2018





KENDALL GATEWAY STUDY



- Led by TXDOT with goal of identifying future transportation routes around Boerne.
- Open House events and online survey
- Expect report and recommendations in late Spring








TRAIL SYSTEM EXPANSION

- Additional 1.1 miles being added with TXDOT Trail Grant funding; 30 cents on the dollar; completion in 3rd qtr 2018
- Expanding Cibolo Creek Trail further south from City Park to the Ranches of Creekside neighborhood
- Adding trail connection from library to the Old No. 9 trail





HOTEL CONFERENCE CENTER

- Partnership with City and Phoenix Hospitality Group
- Approximately 120 rooms
- 7,500 square feet of flexible meeting space
- Full-service restaurant and other hotel amenities
- Located in SOBO off of Christus Parkway
- Broke ground on January 29



CITY HALL

- Randall Scott Architects design 99% complete
- Final price tag pending from Construction Manager at Risk Lee Lewis Construction
 - Approximately 45,000 sq ft; 3 stories
 - Sell structures on Blanco Rd campus; eliminate 3 portables
 - Break ground in May, 2018; move-in late 2019





Major funding threat



- Legislative proposal 2.5% of existing property values will yield approximately \$188,000 in new revenue
- Cost of living increase for city employees of 2% = \$294,000
- One size fits all vs. determining our own destiny as a community
- School finance fix 50% of all property taxes are paid to support public school districts.




